**Zoning:**

The City is zoned, ranging from single residential to business to heavy industrial. Each zone has specific uses and restrictions. Before you begin a project, contact the City Office to be sure it is allowed.

**Flood Plain:**

FEMA has mapped the City designating flood zones. These zones restrict certain building and developments.

**Building Permits:**

Any improvement requires a permit issued by the City. Examples of this are additions, garages, car ports roofing, fencing, concrete work, storage sheds.

**Development Permits:**

These are required for fill dirt if the property is located within the flood plain.

**Burn Permits:**

The City will issue burn permits for brush as authorized by the Fire Chief. The City also has a yard waste dump located at the City wastewater lagoons. You can pick up a key at the City office.

**Animals and Pets:**

The City has an ordinance limiting the type of animal and the number you can possess. Dogs and cats require licensing every year. Licensing requires proof of rabies vaccination. ***Be aware that Pit Bull Terriers (including mixed breeds) are strictly prohibited within city limits.***

**Government:**

Local government consists of an elected Mayor/Council. Meetings are the first Monday of every month at 6:00 pm. Meetings are open to the public and citizen participation is encouraged. If you have an issue to discuss, please contact the City Clerk to be placed on the meeting agenda. Meetings are held in the back room of City Hall.
